Session 1 - EVIL

How can anyone believe in God in the face of such horrific suffering?

Examining the Problem of Evil and whether the traditional theodicies adequately address it. This session will explore what we mean by evil and whether it conclusively disproves the existence of the God of classical theism or any other kind of God we might imagine.

Session 2 - EXPERIENCE

Can we trust our experiences to reveal truth?

Unpacking the range of religious and paranormal experiences that have been used to affirm the reality of a world beyond. What are the hallmarks of a religious experience? Have we all had one or has no one had one? And is experience a reliable method for knowing anything?

Session 3 - HUMAN NATURE

What are we and are we broken?

This session will look at BOTH what it means to be human in terms of the distinctions between mind, body and soul as well as our nature as human beings. Are we 'born sinful'? Or is the doctrine of original sin a nonsense. Is there a basis for believing that we are more than material objects? And do we need saving?

Session 4 – SEX

Is it all a fuss about nothing?

Examining both Christian Ethics (traditional and liberal) and Secular ethical approaches to sex in all its forms. This session will span the ethical spectrum and apply each ethical theory to issues of homosexuality, premarital sex, adultery, pornography and prostitution.
