

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Session 1 - LIFE

Is life expendable?

Examining the ethical approaches of Kant, Bentham, Aristotle and Aquinas in addressing the question of whether it is ever right to take or tamper with life. With particular application to Euthanasia and current technological advances, we will explore the Sanctity of Life principle and whether it has any relevance in a secular culture.

Session 2 - EVIL

How can anyone believe in God in the face of such horrific suffering?

Examining the Problem of Evil and whether the traditional theodicies adequately address it. This session will explore what we mean by evil and whether it conclusively disproves the existence of the God of classical theism or any other kind of God we might imagine.

Session 3 - GENDER

Does gender matter?

Examining the development of feminism, changing attitudes towards gender and the impact of Christian theology on gender bias. We will explore how theories of Ethics, Language and God are impacting this debate and ask whether a gender neutral society is possible of even desirable?

Session 4 - HUMAN NATURE

What are we and are we broken?

This session will look at BOTH what it means to be human in terms of the distinctions between mind, body and soul as well as our nature as human beings. Are we 'born sinful'? Or is the doctrine of original sin a nonsense. Is there a basis for believing that we are more than material objects? And do we need saving?
